




A variety native to Rioja, slow to ripen, a lesser-known grape which is difficult to grow, bunches are small. A modern, crisp wine with strong aromas.

Writings from the early twentieth century speak of a variety that 'gives grace to the wines of Rioja', hence the name **graciano**.

Soaked and fermented in stainless steel tanks at a controlled temperature of 25 ° C for 10 days. The wine matures 6 months in the barrel.
